



MATERIALS LIST

Traditional oil painting supplies include paint, medium brushes, palettes, canvas, or board. You may bring what you have. Students should have their own Plein Air equipment and be able to set it up independently.

For those wanting to buy an easel, that would be their biggest expense initially.

Any easel that can be easily taken outside will work. A small table to hold the palette and accessories will be needed if the easel isn't equipped for that. Fancy equipment is not necessary, but the convenience of a good travel easel makes everything easier. Here are links to a few common easel solutions.
