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Alcohol Inks on Ceramics Faith Cleveland March 9th (Saturday)

Alcohol inks love a non-porous surface, so they're perfect for adding interest to glazed ceramics or china. You will learn the many techniques of alcohol inks on ceramic tiles and more. It is mesmerizing to watch all of the different effects you can get.



Come and explore the medium of Pen and Ink. This class will share techniques, ideas, and tips in this introduction to working with Pen and Ink, one of the oldest and most basic



methods of putting pen to paper. Using easily obtainable materials, the student will explore moving from the blank page to a three-dimensional drawing, building on simple repetitive techniques.

James (Eureka Springs, AR) has over 45 years of experience in Woodcarving, Pen and Ink, and Watercolor. James teaches locally and sells his work nationally. As past President of ESSA, James is committed to extending art and fine craft education opportunities to all.

You will learn a step-bystep method to simplify the acrylic painting process while learning basic techniques and color theory. You will learn to



choose, mix, and apply colors to your canvas while exploring different subjects in multiple paintings. This method is about building layers to create a beautiful and dynamic work of art.

Jessica (Eureka Springs, AR) earned a BFA in painting and photography. She taught high school art for 15 years. She is now a freelance artist and has experience working with and teaching drawing, painting, jewelry, printmaking, sculpture, and ceramics.

2D STUDIO

Beginning Watercolor Richard Stephens April 11th - 13th (Thurs - Sat) \$235 - Additional material costs may apply - Beginner

In this beginner class, become familiar with the essential tools of the trade:

brushes, water, paints, and paper through guided exercises in color mixing, creating textures, the importance of "timing" in watercolor, and water/pigment ratio. Richard will share a few "tricks" to use in watercolor, suggestions on working from photos, the importance of developing basic drawing skills, and doing value sketches. In this class, exposure to the tools and physics of watercolor is the focus. There is a demonstration painting each day; the students work on their paintings with lots of one-on-one time with the instructor.

Richard (Hot Springs, AR) graduated from the University of Central Arkansas in 1969 with a degree in art. Richard enjoyed a 45 year career as a freelance Commercial Artist/Graphic Designer/Illustrator. He has been conducting workshops nationwide for over 20 years. During the past few years, Stephens has won awards in numerous watercolor shows and competitions around the country, and in 2018 was awarded the Arkansas Governor's Arts Award for an Individual Artist.

Experience the fluidity of alcohol inks. Learn how alcohol inks interact with each other and different surfaces. Experiment with various tools and techniques to discover the endless possibilities of this unique medium.

Recently her creativity was sparked through alcohol inks, which renewed her love of painting and creating art. "An enriching flow has worked its way back into my life. Gel Plate Printing Techniques Dana Finimore May 22nd - 24th (Wed - Fri) \$240 - All materials included - All Levels

You will learn how to use a gel plate to create beautiful monotype prints, collage papers, image transfers, and more. With these new techniques, you will create mixed media compositions. Some of the media you will use with this project are paper, glue, images for transfer, stencils, paint, pastels, ink, and texture tools.



Dana (Mountain View, AR) practices painting, clay, and small metals. Dana shows her work at group and solo events. She is a member of the Craftsman's Guild of Mississippi, the Teaching Artist Guild, and the Arkansas Craft School. She earned her MFA from Memphis College of Art.

Figure Drawing Mary Springer May 31st - June 2nd (Fri - Sun)

This figure drawing course will give you a different way of seeing form using the interplay of light, shadow, negative space, and tones to define the figure. Build lifelong skills in this cornerstone of artistic training.

Mary (Eureka Springs, AR) is a sculptor and painter with a BFA from the Memphis College of Art and is one of the founders of the Eureka Springs School of the Arts. She has taught and attended many workshops in different artis-


Drawing with Charcoal and Pastel Dennis McCann June 14th - 16th (Fri - Sun)



Pouring and Atomizing Techniques in Watercolor Donna Twyford June 28th - 30th (Fri - Sun)

\$245 - Additional material costs may apply -All Levels

In this pouring and atomizing workshop, you will isolate values and transfer images to the paper, mask, and pour watercolor pigments in layers, creating beautiful, fluid paintings without brushwork. Students will also use a mouth atomizer to create texture and depth in their



paintings. The goal will be to complete two paintings within the threeday workshop.

Donna (Hot Springs, AR) is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society, a Diamond signature member of MSW, and has had pieces juried into TWSA and LWS. Donna is a self-taught watercolor artist who enjoys the many diverse uses of this medium. Watercolor pouring and atomizing are two techniques she incorporates in her award-winning paintings.



Painting with Oil Pastels Barbara Iglehart July 12th & 13th (Fri - Sat)

\$140 - Additional material costs may apply - All Levels

Learn to paint with Oil Pastels. You will create beautiful translucent passages or gooey impasto effects. This wonderfully versatile medium has a playful element that lends itself to a more freestyle painting. You can use this on a wide range of papers and substrates. It is known for its brilliant colors. It also comes in metallic and fluorescent pigments.



Barbara (Garfield, AR) earned her BA in Fine Arts from Arkansas Tech University and continued her education in art at the University of Arkansas and Arkansas State University in Jonesboro. She teaches soft and oil pastels at the Adult Wellness Center in Rogers, Arkansas.

Expand Your Water Mixable Oil Painting Skills Vic Mastis Aug 2nd - 4th (Fri - Sun)

\$140 - All materials included - Intermediate

You will do exercises to take you further in your oil painting journey using non-toxic watermixable oils. You will incorporate the elements of art and dive deep into color families. You will use a palette knife—work from your own photos or the instructor's. You'll go home with at least three paintings. All supplies will be set up for you to explore, and you will receive lots of one-on-one instruction.

Vic (Branson, MO), a professional artist for over 35 years, founded Gateway Pastel Artists in MO and is a

signature member of the Arkansas Pastel Society, MVIS, MidAmerica Pastel Society, and more. Former owner of a gallery in Webster Groves, MO, her work has received many awards.





Throwing on the Wheel Jessica Ames-Russell June 24th - 28th (Mon - Fri) \$395 - All materials included -Beginner/Intermediate

You will learn to throw pottery on the wheel. It would also be an excellent refresher for those who have been



away from the wheel for a while. We will learn the basics of kneading & wedging, centering, forming, and footing pieces. There is a built-in day for glazing that will happen two weeks after class completion.

Glazing Your Pots Jessica Ames-Russell July 13th (Saturday) \$120 - All materials included -All Levels

Students must have taken Throwing on The Wheel (June 24-28) to take this workshop

You will spend the day glazing your clay pots. You must be registered



for the "Throwing on the Wheel" workshop with Jessica Ames-Russell to be eligible for this workshop. It is part two of the class, to fire a selection of your work from part one of the class.

Jessica (Eureka Springs, AR) earned a BFA in painting and photography. She taught high school art for 15 years. She is now a freelance artist and has experience working with and teaching drawing, painting, jewelry, printmaking, sculpture, and ceramics.

Mixed Media Doll -Clay and Fabric Lisa Crews July 20th - August 10th (3 Hour Sessions Over Four Saturdays) \$395 - All materials included -Beginner/Intermediate

Learn to use clay to model the head and neck, arms and hands, and legs and feet with attention to proportion. Color will be added to the pieces of the doll using underglaze, glaze, or paint. You will use hand stitching methods like sewing on a button. Hand sewing and machine sewing can combine to create the clothes for the doll and embellishments to finish.

Lisa (Eureka Springs, AR) has ten years of experience teaching public school art, classes at community centers, in her studio, and private one-on-one lessons. Recently she served as the ESSA Ceramics Artist in Residence.

Preston (Eureka Springs, AR) has many years of experience in all kinds of welding, having set up and run his own welding business, as well as a welding shop in the Kansas City area for a large manufacturing facility.

Bladesmithing Allen Newberry March 21st - 24th (Thurs - Sun) \$395 - All materials included - All Levels

Dive into bladesmithing by forging your own knife. Use a hammer



and anvil to forge a medium-sized, full tang knife from carbon steel and learn the basics of heat treating with a forge. Finish your project by grinding the blade and adding a handle to your knife.

Allen (Lowell, AR) is a Journeyman Smith with the American Bladesmith Society and Arkansas's first Forged in Fire Champion. He enjoys working with steel to create pieces that are aesthetically pleasing yet are quite functional.

Welded Sculpture with Found Materials Joe Malesky

April 12th - 14th (Fri - Sun)

\$255 - All materials included - All Levels

Create abstract metal sculptures using reclaimed steel along with found objects. A focus on the design process that Joe calls spontaneous design will be introduced, encouraging you to incorporate balance and negative space in your sculpture. You will use cutting, welding, drilling, grinding, and some forge and anvil work to shape the steel for the sculpture.

Joe (Strafford, MO) started welding and working with metal at age 13. He found a way to turn his industrial experience into an art form. Joe is represented by art galleries throughout Missouri and has sculptures in municipal shows in nine states MO, CO, SD, NE, KS, IL, IA, MA, and GA.



IRON STUDIO

Found Object Sculpture Tom Flynn April 19th - 21st (Fri - Sun) \$255 - All materials included - Beginner/ Intermediate

Learn metal shop safety, cutting methods, grinding, welding, forge heating/bending, and finishing techniques. Make a crab from circular saw blades or a ladybug from bollard caps. Design a second project utilizing metal objects you bring or choose from a pile of objects provided by the instructor.

Tom (Bentonville, AR) grew up in west Texas in

the town of Odessa and currently lives in Rogers Arkansas. Tom is a former Benedictine brother from a monastery in New Mexico. He has been doing found object metal art for the last 15 years and has public art installations in Rogers and Little Rock Arkansas. He lives in Rogers Arkansas where he works as a lighting and electrical designer. Tom also brews beer and makes home made root beer, writes music and plays several types of musical instruments.

Intro to Welding Darla Gray-Winter April 27th (Saturday) \$100 - All materials included - All Levels

Learn the basic operation of a wire feed MIG welder, different types of welds (tack welds, fill welds, etc.), metal



cutting, and grinding. You will practice the different types of welding used for metal art and learn when to use them. You will create a small paperweight sized project to keep that utilizes all the applications above.

Darla (Golden, MO) began in woodworking by building guitars. Now working in multiple media, Darla does woodturning, beginning welded art, and small metal

works.

Beginning Blacksmithing Dale Custer

May 16th - 18th (Thurs - Sat) \$265 - All materials included - Beginner

This class introduces blacksmithing and is the perfect opportunity to get oriented to ESSA's Iron Studio. You will learn the proper way to swing a hammer, safe practices for forging, hammer-work, and various tools. You'll go home with a bottle opener, meat turner, J hooks, and a top set tool.

Dale (Roland, AR) began blacksmithing over 10 years ago with a class at a local university. He has always enjoyed bringing new knowledge to those that are searching for it and mixes fun with information.



Intro to Plasma Cutting: Slicing Metal with Fire Bobby Babcock May 31st - June 2nd (Fri - Sun) \$275 - All materials included - Beginner

You will learn metal fabrication skills and discover how to



cut through metal like butter. You will use a plasma torch to sculpt whimsical creations for your home or garden. You will use a broad selection of metal pieces and colorful beads to create unique art that will last for years.

Robert (Tulsa, OK) is a metalsmith and painter. He holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts from the University of Oklahoma with a concentration in painting. He is the primary art instructor and lead builder at Garden Deva Sculpture Company, a whimsical garden decor shop based in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He owns and operates Garden Deva with his wife, Kari.

You will learn to create hollow forms, small boxes, and a variety of lockets in this silversmithing class. All



skill levels are welcome, as each technique has several ways to execute and levels of complexity (or simplicity) to explore.

Jewelry Pas de Deux combines two signature techniques, miniature hollowware and reinforced armatures. This 5-day



class explores an array of original small forms and armatures through clay layering and multi-cycle curing, building elements suitable for jewelry. The results are strong, light and reproducible pieces, for use as beads, brooches, or pendants. A technique workshop, not project specific, students need a working knowledge of polymer clay.

tools in pitch to create a three dimensional work of art. Complete a copper cuff with a bee or butterfly, plus an additional project if time allows.






Needle Felting Vicki Hardcastle April 20th - 21st (Sat - Sun) \$165 - All materials included -Beginner

You will learn how timber is selected and stripped to build this beautiful piece of Ozark Tradition.

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Waste Basket and Square Pie Basket Billy Owens May 18th (Saturday)

You will make two white oak baskets, The Waste Basket and The Square Pie. All materials come from trees Billy has cut and prepared using his Dad's homemade tools. You will learn to weave a "herringbone" bottom in each of them using a mold; you will take home two beautiful Ozark-style white oak baskets.

Small Williamsburg Basket Billy Owens May 19th (Sunday) \$155 - All materials included -All Levels

You will make an Ozarkstyle white oak basket. This basket has an 8" X 8" square bottom with a 12" round top and is approximately 8.5" deep. All materials, steeped in tradition, come from trees cut and prepared by hand using homemade hand tools passed down from Billy's Dad.





Billy (Jenkins, MO) is a second-generation White Oak basket maker from the Ozark mountains of Southern Missouri. He travels the country teaching and sharing this tradition since 1999. Billy was recently honored at the Smithsonian "Folk Life Festival" in Washington, DC. He displays baskets at the Missouri Botanical Gardens in St. Louis.

Crocheted Lantern Gina Gallina June 7th - 9th (Fri - Sun)

You will create a Crocheted Lantern. You will learn basic crochet techniques to create the flower forms to make your lantern, fabric stiffening processes, and some connecting techniques. Explore crochet, color, and form to make your unique finished lantern to take home.
