ESSA offers individual scholarships that fully cover tuition for any workshop and also include materials for many workshops.



Experience the fluidity of alcohol inks and how they interact on different surfaces. Experiment with tools and techniques to explore the medium's many creative possibilities.






# Fluffy Watercolor Friends with Cynthia Schanink

Embellish pre-formed ceramic pieces using wax resist and raku glazes, then experience the dramatic process of burning horsehair and feathers onto pottery. You'll fire three vessels, each showing the creative possibilities of raku.



### Welded Sculpture with Found Materials with Joe Malesky

Create abstract steel sculptures using reclaimed metal and found objects. Explore Joe's "spontaneous design" process while learning cutting, welding, grinding, and basic forging for shaping steel. Thanks to instructor Joe Malesky's generosity, all proceeds from this workshop will support ESSA's capital fund.



Joe (Strafford, MO) began welding at 13 and turned industrial skills into an art career. His sculptures appear in galleries across Missouri and municipal shows in nine states.




