

Making Your Own Texture Plates and Simple Molds Supply List

1. Polymer Clay (I use premo by sculpey because it has a little flexibility) or you could use your scraps for the texture plates.
2. Polymer Clay premo or souffle by sculpey for creating some pieces to use with your texture plates you made
3. Pasta machine dedicated to polymer clay
4. Roller (clear plastic is what I use). You could use pvc pipe about 8" length
5. Tissue blade
6. Surface to work on (I use a tempered glass small tabletop or cutting board with a graph for measuring taped under it). You can also find some tempered glass with a graph already on it but be sure it is a smooth surface (Do not use wood please)
7. Cookie cutters might come in handy
8. Copy paper about 10 sheets
9. Rubbing alcohol in a spray bottle for cleanup or Baby wipes
10. Paper towels or old hand towel
11. Plastic gloves to protect hands
12. Parchment paper for smoothing surface of clay plus a smooth metal spoon
13. Cornstarch
14. Oven for curing your pieces (dedicated toaster oven works great) and oven thermometer
15. Make sure you wear your glasses if you need them for close vision and have good lighting
16. Found objects to create texture and items to make molds. I am going to do a doll face mold, old buttons are nice
17. Clay extruder (Fondant extruder works good from [Amazon](#))
18. Magic Mold Silicone Puddy (<https://www.rawmaterialsuppliers.com/product/blue-silicone-putty/>)

19. Hot glue gun
20. Old sheet of glass about 8x10" (We will be putting the hot glue on it)
21. Vaseline
22. Q tips
23. Toothpicks
